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COLOURS COMMITTEE

The members of the Rynfield Primary Colours Committee consist of:

- The Principal
- The Deputy Principal
- Head of Sport
- Person in charge of the specific sport
- Secretary Sports Administrator
- o Appointed members of staff in various activities

GENERAL

Roles and responsibilities of the committee:

- 1. The Colours Policy will apply from the 1st of January to the 31st of December of each year. Changes to the policy will only take affect from the 1st of January of the following year.
- 2. All members of the Colours Committee are to attend a meeting once a year to amend policy where necessary. If the policy does not change, the policy stands for the following year.
- 3. All members are expected to attend all the colours meetings prior to colours assembly. This meeting is used to ratify colours before the assemblies. Master in Charge of the particular sports being discussed will be invited to meetings.
- 4. It must be clearly understood by learners, educators and parents that the awarding of colours is **not** merely a reward of good performance, but rather recognition of overall excellence of achievement, ability, behaviour and dedication towards the activity and the school.



- 5. Standards should not be allowed to change during the year. Changes can only be made during the Annual colours meeting where proposed changes can be brought to the attention of the committee and the SGB once the criteria is approved by the Colours Committee.
- 6. If the learner ceases to do the activity for a period of 2 years, his colours will be withdrawn, except if the sporting code is no longer offered at Rynfield Primary School. ie. soccer.
- 7. The criteria should be of such a standard that it should maintain value and status and offer challenges for the learners.
- 8. All colours are awarded at the Committee's discretion (the freedom to decide what should be done in a particular situation). It is the Colours Committee's responsibility to look at the learners objectively and apply the criteria objectively.

CATEGORY OF AWARDS AND COLOURS

- 1.1 Team awards (Grades 1-7) for Swimming, Athletics, Chess and Equestrian.
- 1.2 Team awards (Grades 3 7) for Rugby, Netball, Softball, Hockey and Cricket.
- 2.1 Merit awards (Grades 1-7) for Swimming, Athletics, Cross Country, Equestrian and Eisteddfod.
- 2.2 Merit awards (Grades 3 7) for Rugby, Netball, Softball, Hockey, Chess and Cricket.
- 3. Half Colours (Grades 4-7) for all sport and cultural activities.
- 4. Full Colours (Grades 4 7) for all sport and cultural activities.
- 5. Honours Awards (Grades 4-7) for all sport and cultural activities.
- 6. Red Honours Blazer (only awarded for a sport or cultural activity that RPS participates in a league format).

AWARDS POLICIES

POLICY FOR HONOURS SCROLL

- Awarded to learners who have exceeded the full colours criteria in a specific sport. Each extra-mural has a points system for the honours scroll.
- The points system will be available on our D6 communicator at the beginning of the season.

POLICY FOR FULL COLOURS SCROLL

- Learners are required to meet criteria for full colours (scroll) based on a point system and set criteria for the extra-mural.
- The points system will be available on our D6 communicator at the beginning of the season.



POLICY FOR HALF COLOURS SCROLL

- Learners are required to meet criteria for half colours (bar) based on a point system and set criteria for the extra-mural.
- The points system will be available on our D6 communicator at the beginning of the season.

POLICY FOR MERIT AWARDS

- Learners are required to meet criteria for a merit badge based on a point system and set criteria for the extra-mural.
- A merit badge may be awarded to learners in Grades one to three who qualifies. These learners must be a part of a team that competes in league-participating in a mini sport will not qualify the learners for a merit badge.

POLICY FOR TEAM COLOURS AND AWARDS

- Teams are required to meet criteria for team colours or awards based on a point system and set criteria for the activity.
- Where a team/group activity has done exceptionally well throughout the season, e.g. winners of a league or semi-finals winners, consideration must be given to the strength of the opposition and the type of format of competitions. Decisions must be based on the opposition and how far the team has progressed over and above being league winners/ semi-finalists.
- Each activity has its criteria for team colours or awards.

LEAGUE WINNERS BADGE (TEAM)

• If a 'B' Team wins their league, they will receive a Team League Winners Badge.
