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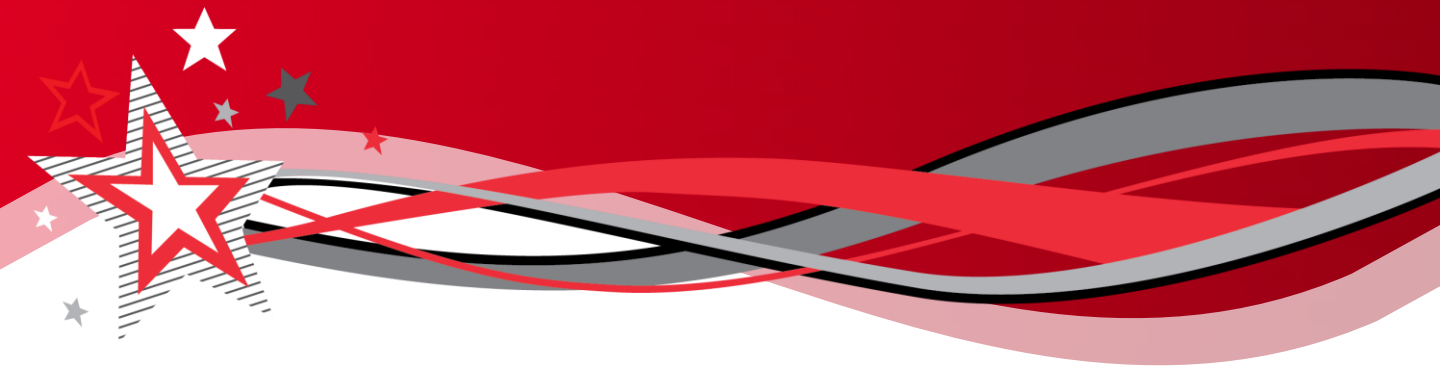

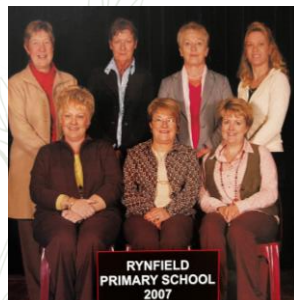
Her commitment, kindness and unwavering work ethic have truly made RPS a better place. Louise has not only been a valued member of staff, but also a friend to so many.

Our learners celebrated this academic day by reading books, discussing stories and some even took part in a Read and Illustrate Challenge.

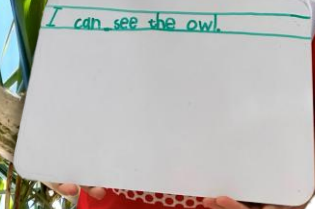
These learners had to listen carefully as a vivid descriptive paragraph was read to them. They then had to draw their interpretation of the story by using their imagination and creativity.



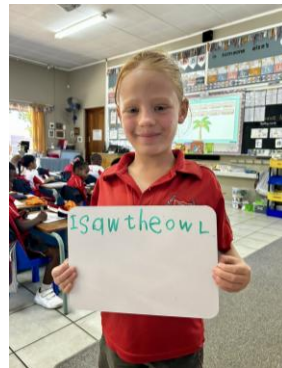
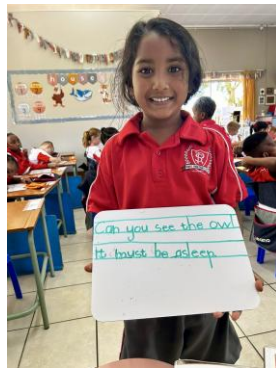
